Motions before a judge in chambers – News and reminders

NOTICE

- As of August 25, 2014, the rolls of the judge in chambers in Montreal (Room RC.18) and Quebec City (Room 4.30) will be closed once the maximum number of motions has been reached.
 - <u>During the judicial year</u>, a maximum of <u>8 motions</u> per day will be placed on the roll;
 - <u>During the summer months</u>, a maximum of <u>15 motions</u> per day will be placed on the roll on Wednesdays in Montreal and on Thursdays in Quebec City.
- In the event that the roll is complete, the Clerk will set a new date of presentation. Should this date be inconvenient, the applicant will be required to produce a new notice of presentation.
- All supporting documentation must be annexed to the motion (subsection 22(1) of the Rules of the Court of Appeal of Quebec in Civil Matters or subsection 34(1) of the Rules of the Court of Appeal of Quebec in Criminal Matters). Failure to provide all necessary documents will result in the motion not being heard and deferred to a later date.
- The applicant must also specify in the caption of his motion the statutory provision(s) on which it is based, as contemplated by article 11 of the Rules of the Court of Appeal of Quebec in Civil Matters or article 11 of the Rules of the Court of Appeal of Quebec in Criminal Matters. Failure to comply with this requirement may result in the hearing of the motion being delayed.
